

Could you be a member of the Lincolnshire Joint Local Access Forum?

Are you a landowner or farmer in Lincolnshire or North-East Lincolnshire with experience of managing public access on your land?

Lincolnshire's Joint Local Access Forum is seeking landowners and farmers to share their expertise and experience in managing public access.

The Forum is an advisory body which provides opportunities for members to be informed of and influence strategic access related matters across Lincolnshire and North East Lincolnshire.

The Forum comprises a wide range of people representing users of public rights of way (for example, walkers, cyclists, horse riders and carriage drivers), landowners and people with other interests in local access such as tourism, rural economy, health and wellbeing, education, nature conservation, sustainable transport, social exclusion, disability access and coastal issues.

Forum members act in a voluntary capacity, with paid expenses for the costs of mileage and any child-care provision incurred. Meetings will take place a minimum twice a year and will take place at Lincolnshire County Council County Offices, Lincoln, during the daytime. Members will be appointed to the Forum on a three-year basis.
